

# Seven Syllable Words

The complete A to Z list, plus words for kids, nature, and everyday use

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A syllable is a single beat of sound built around one vowel. Say “cat” and you’ve used one. Say “totalitarianism” and you’ve used seven. This length shows up most in law, medicine, and academic writing, though a handful of these words get used every day without anyone noticing how long they are.
